Lane's Cooperative Education program gives your organization the opportunity to:

- Receive assistance with projects from qualified interns.
- Contribute your expertise to the professionalism of new GIS technicians and support geospatial education.
- Evaluate potential employees without a long-term commitment.

Having a co-op student is easy and effective

- GIS co-op students understand the relationship between spatial data and visual display and ArcInfo. This allows them to successfully participate in project development and completion.
- Students work 10 to 20 hours a week for 11 weeks while enrolled in other courses.
- Cooperative Education can be paid or non-paid.
- Workers compensation is provided by the college for non-paid interns.
- Typically, students can be productive within a few weeks after they have been oriented and know your project expectations.
- Paper work is minimal (See the employer handbook – link below).

Your role as a co-op supervisor

- Offer real-world experience in GIS applications.
- Guide student work and progress during the internship.
- Meet with the student and the co-op coordinator once a term and provide individualized feedback to the student.
