

1. Rec - Fields used to identify the data.
2. FID - Fields used to identify the data.
3. PLACENAME – Country Name.
4. GDP_mill – The Gross Domestic Product in 2007 - value of goods and services produced in a given year.
5. Per_ag – Percent of population working in agriculture.
6. Per_IND – Percent of population working in industry.
7. Per_Serv – Percent of population working in service
8. Per_unempl – Percent of population unemployed.
9. Per_bepov – Percent of population living below poverty level.
10. M_age – Average age of the population.
11. M_agemale - Average age of male population.
12. M_ageFE – Average age of female population.
13. IMR_2006 - The infant mortality **rate**. Number of deaths of infants under one year old in a year per 1,000 live births in the same year. This rate is often used as an indicator of the level of health in a country.
14. IMR_M2006 - The infant mortality rate male only.
15. IMR_F2006 - The infant mortality rate female only.
16. LIFEEXP - Life Expectancy - Average number of years lived by people born in the same year. Life expectancy is also a measure of overall quality of life in a country and summarizes the mortality at all ages.
17. LIVEEXP_M – Life expectancy males only.
18. LIVEEXP_F Life expectancy females only.
19. TFR – Total fertility rate. Average number of children that would be born per woman **if** all women lived to the end of their childbearing years.
20. DRS_1000 – Number of doctors for every 1000 people.
21. NUR_100 – Number of nurses for every 10000 people.
22. Phworker_1 – Number of public health worker for every 1,000 people.
23. PerGDP_HTH - Percent of the GDP spend on health care.
24. HOSBED_10K – Number of hospital beds for every 10,000 people.
25. pop09 - Estimated population in 2009.
26. LWJIV07 – Number of people living with HIV/Aids in 2007.
